



What constitutes a high quality evidence-based systematic review?


According to JBI systematic reviews use the following steps:

- 1. Developing a rigorous proposal or protocol
- 2. Stating the questions or hypotheses to be pursued in the review
- 3. Identifying the criteria to be used to select the literature
- 4. Detailing a strategy to identify all relevant literature
- 5. Establishing how the quality of primary studies will be assessed or critically appraised and any exclusion criteria based on quality considerations
- 6. Detailing how data will be extracted from the primary research regarding the participants, the intervention, the outcome measures and the results
- 7. Setting out a plan of how the data extracted will be

Why the Joanna Briggs Institute makes a difference

- Academic libraries requirement for evidence-based nursing resources:
 - "Every curriculum is now focusing on information that is evidence-based"
 - "Our nursing library has just been reaccredited...evidence-based resources are required for accreditation"

- Difficult to find information that thoroughly evidence-based and focused on nursing and allied health:
 - "There are several databases which focus on evidence-based medicine, but it is hard to get good evidence-based nursing information."


SUMARI is a developing software package designed to assist health and other researchers and practitioners to conduct systematic reviews.


