The article is destined for the archivists and supplies information on the methods used in Roman Egypt to preserve official records, and deals with various recorders as they appear in the Greek papyri from all periods.

Leopold Wenger, *Papyrologische Miszelle zu P. Hamb. 72* (Studi in onore di V. Arangio-Ruiz IV, 419—422).

In this article the author refers to the importance of the formulaires for the wording of deeds and makes some suggestions about the reading of P. Hamb. 72. His suggestion in the line 3: *substitutione mutua* (cf. Papin. Dig. 31, 64) *quaeque pars hereditatis* is very plausible.

Walter Till, *Koptische Parallelurkunden* (Studi in onore di V. Arangio-Ruiz IV, 197).

In his essay *τσον* and *ἀντίγραφον* Bernhard Kübler is concerned with the manner of drawing up and duplicating Greek deeds. He has proved that *ἀντίγραφον* denotes the original copy whereas *τσον* is the duplicate, the second authentic copy. Therefore *τσα* are two identical copies of the same deed. Walter Till in his article deals with these questions in regard to Coptic deeds.
