### **AUTHORITARIANISM: AN EMPIRICAL FACTOR IN EDUCATION AND PERSONALITY RESEARCH**

(Summary)

Authoritarian persons are characterised by a specific relationship to authority. The author of the article offers a view of some more important classical and latest researches in the above mentioned field of psychology. The survey contains indications on where the researches are undertaken, which methods are used. Special attention is paid to the great variety of the subject discussed. Psychologists of many continents and universities are very interested in the nature of authoritarian personality, in correlations between authoritarianism and other traits of personality such as dogmatism, rigidity, academic achievement, religion and morality dimension, social attitudes, results of education, political dispositions and so on.

Next the stages of development and the Polish version of the F scale is offered with a brief characterizations of subscales. The article is ended with some critical remarks. The author announces the researches with the F scale in the Academy of Catholic Theology in Warsaw as well.
