

Summary

QUESTION

What is the safety and effectiveness of benzodiazepines in alcohol withdrawal?

CLINICAL BOTTOM LINE

Alcohol withdrawal syndrome comprises of a cluster of symptoms that occur in alcohol-dependent people after cessation or reduction in alcohol use.
 • The results of individual studies showed that benzodiazepines were effective against alcohol withdrawal symptoms, in particular seizures, when compared to placebo. Effectiveness compared with other medications was not established due to trial heterogeneity. (Level I)

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE EVIDENCE

11 of seven randomised controlled trials (RCTs) covering 4,051 patients were included in the review. The intervention was a fixed or symptom-triggered schedule of a benzodiazepine compared with another benzodiazepine, placebo or other drug. Benzodiazepine combined with another drug versus that drug alone was also compared. The primary outcome measures of interest were severity of overall alcohol withdrawal syndrome as measured in pre-specified scales, alcohol withdrawal seizures and alcohol withdrawal delirium.

BEST PRACTICE RECOMMENDATIONS

• The use of benzodiazepines is recommended for symptom control, particularly seizures in people with alcohol withdrawal, although safety and efficacy may not be higher than other medications. (Grade B)

Labor, Birth & After Care > Birth Recuperation

- The postpartum period is considered to be a very important time in life for a woman called "lying-in" period (Ottani 2001).
- The postpartum period may be considered a "cold" state, and new mothers may believe it best to
 - stay in the house
 - avoid cold foods and drinks*
 - avoid wind or cold air/drafts
 - not bathe or shower
 - not use ice packs
 - abstain from physical work and excessive pleasurable activities (e.g., sex)
- The mother-in-law may be very involved with the new infant and the new mother's recovery. She should be included when caring for the mother and during education sessions.
- Some women do not have sexual intercourse for months following birth, believing that it is best to allow their bodies to recover and heal from pregnancy.

***Note: Not wanting cold beverages may have implications in preventing dehydration in new Asian mothers. It is important to inquire about preferred temperature of beverages.**
