agreement (ἀντισύγγραφοι ὁμολογίαι) drawn up at Hermopolis in the year 586 A.D. The parties of the agreement are Aurelius Justus son of Sampsichus, cellarman, and on the other side Aurelia [...], both described as Samaritans by religion. Another papyrus belonging to the Egypt Exploration Society and stored in the same box as the present document is also addressed to a Samaritan. The names Manasses and Symeon, mentioned in this papyrus (P. Misc. Inv. No. I, 53(c)) have a distinctly Hebraic flavour. It is probable that the papyrus, too, comes from Hermopolis. It is suggested, therefore, that there was a Samaritan community in Hermopolis, and that this community was legally recognized as having a certain religious (non-Christian) affiliation. As far as the provisions of the document in question are concerned, the provision that the daughter shall share her time between the two parents is noteworthy (cf. my Law² 121 ff.).
